The Université de Sherbrooke's Department of Pedagogy has two vocational education programs. One is an undergraduate program (baccalauréat en enseignement professionnel, BEP) with English-language and French-language tracks designed for educators currently teaching at a vocational institution and for professionals who aspire to teach their trade. There is also a Frenchlanguage graduate degree, the Diplôme d'études supérieures spécialisées de 2e cycle d'intervention en formation professionnelle (DESSIFP), designed for vocational training educators, academic advisers, and directors, as well as workplace instructors.

BEP students teach vocational training, which is key in providing skilled labour to rise to the challenge of Quebec's socioeconomic future. This makes vocational training particularly sensitive to job market shifts caused by automation, digitalization and labour shortages, resulting in increasingly complex jobs.

At the same time, the Quebec government is modernizing vocational training. This modernization includes promoting initiatives like increasing the number of short qualifying training programs and of different training systems and methods (hybrid and online, simultaneous with general secondary education, work-study programs, individualized training, etc.), enhancing work-integrated learning (work-study programs and comprehensive work-integrated learning) and recognizing work skills and knowledge. As a result, every aspect and structure of vocational education is being re-examined (funding, assessment, organization), which will impact how training and vocational education are developed in Quebec.

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Expertise

Candidates' expertise must be related to one or more of the following themes:

- Governance, education policy and school system organization, including vocational education, to be able to understand the changes, issues and economic, political and social repercussions on vocational education systems, institutions, employees and students.
- Experiential learning and work-integrated learning (WIL) to better understand the reality of vocational education in the workplace and the related organizational, didactic and pedagogical issues.
- Linguistic and cultural diversity, to understand and account for the needs of students, particularly in vocational education, and educators from diverse linguistic and cultural backgrounds.
- Measuring and assessing learning in a vocational training setting.
- Expertise in a field related to adult education.

Duties

- Undergraduate and graduate level teaching in your area of expertise, mainly in the vocational education program.
- Researching vocational education in English-speaking environments.
- Mentoring graduate students (supervision of essays, masters, and theses).
- Developing and maintaining the bachelor's degree program in English-language vocational education.
- Involvement in academic life and community service.

Requirements

- Hold a Ph.D. in education or a related field.
- Have a strong interest in research in vocational training and adult education (disciplinary, interdisciplinary, in collaboration with stakeholders, etc.).
- Have a record of publications on relevant topics (peer-reviewed journals at the national and international level, professional journals, etc.).
- Demonstrate leadership qualities, initiative, and excellent communication skills, both effectively and harmoniously with colleagues, students, and internal and external partners.

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- Show ease in working as a team member and in synergy with fellow professors, professionals, and academic staff.
- High proficiency in the English language.
- Functional proficiency in spoken and written French.
- Ability to comply with the requirements of <u>responsible research conduct</u>.

Assets

- Postdoctoral research experience in one of the focus areas
- Knowledge of Quebec's English-language educational system
- Familiarity with a vocational education training program
- Experience with distance education
