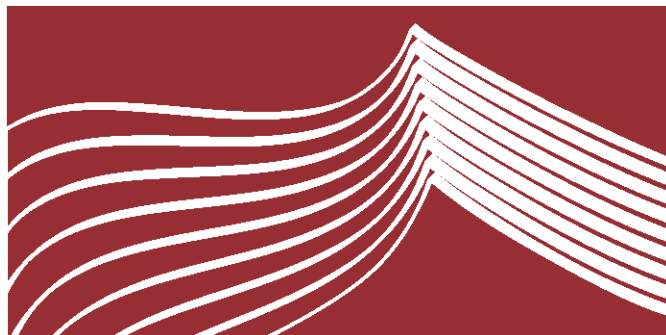

In addition, thanks to a MEES grant, she had the privilege of becoming the coordinator for the English BVE program, where she supported Vocational Education student teachers, managed the budget, created a research, consolidated partnerships (PROCEDE, QACVE, MEES and school boards) and collaborated with teachers to develop new learning material for face to face and distance learning activities.

Since 2018, Carolyn was the only PEDAGOGICAL ADVISOR for the Bachelor of Vocational Education (English), Université de Sherbrooke where she coordinated the adaptation, translation and development of the course offer and distance learning. She worked to enrich communications with English-speaking partners (PROCEDE, QACVE, MEES, school boards, associate teachers, mentors). She participated in the development of research on the characteristics and needs of English-speaking students at the Université de Sherbrooke, in order to obtain a better understanding of their reality. She was responsible for managing the budget of the ECQ grant as well as the various reports.

From 2016 to 2018, she was a COURSE INSTRUCTOR for the Bachelor of Vocational Education, Université de Sherbrooke, where she was in charge of several courses, internship supervision and project specialist for the French and English components of the program.

With the Covid situation this past spring, she believe that the world of education is evolving faster than ever and we need to be able to follow suite in order to support the many people who will need to update their skills, specifically through VT, in the coming years.
